"YE MUST BE BORN AGAIN"

From this glorious text of John 3:7 we are not going to discuss the personal application of the "Ye", nor the absolute necessity for regeneration as declared in the "must", nor yet the fact that the Christian is made and does not make the new creation (as implied in the "be"), nor yet the fact that spiritual birth is as much a change in one's life as was the natural birth (as set out by the word "again"); but rather we are going to discuss one of the analogies between the bodily life and the spiritual life, as suggested by our Lord's calling salvation a being "born".

Of the many likenesses between the bodily and the spiritual life, we shall consider only this: proper health comes to both in the same way. Foundationally, the good health of your body depends on food and exercise; the same is true of your spirit.

With an insufficient quantity of food your body becomes thin, weak, emaciated; this will happen in your spiritual life if you fail to feed on the one who said, "I am the bread of life". Eating an unbalanced diet may bring diabetes, pellagra, scurvy, rickets; holding to one line of Bible truth to the exclusion of all others may result in spiritual malnutrition and deformity. BUILDING REFORM

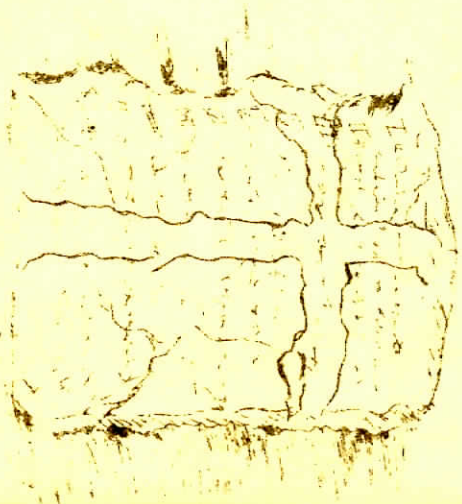
